EXAMINATION POLICY (2023-24)

The Examination Cell of the College functions based on the schedule and calendar prepared by it. It contains information on registration of eligible students for the examinations, issuing Hall Tickets, setting question papers, conducting examinations, valuing the answer papers, publishing the results and finally the graduation day. The Examination Cell strictly adheres to the schedule.

The Examination Cell of the College also conducts tests for Continuous Internal Assessment (CIA I & CIA II), Model Examination and the End Semester Examinations as per the guidelines fixed by the Academic Council of the Institution.

All the Course Faculty will submit a duly scrutinized Question Bank following the various levels in Bloom's Taxonomy. The Question Bank will be uploaded in the Software for the generation of Question Paper for CIA Tests, Model Examinations and the End Semester Examinations.

After scrutinization of question papers, the final draft of the question paper will be prepared. The copies of the Question Paper will be printed in the strong room in the presence of the Controller of Examinations. The details of printing will be recorded separately. The Question Papers will be sealed and stored under the custody of Controller of Examinations. If there is any wastage during printing process, it will be stored in the sealed wooden box which is placed in the Strong Room. The same will be destroyed only after the completion of all the Examinations for that particular semester.

The final examination for the various programs will be conducted at the end of each semester (for odd semester in the month of November and for even semester in the month of May).

The Examinations will be conducted with the help of a team of faculty members. Faculty members will be appointed as invigilators and the Heads of the Departments will be appointed as members of the squad to monitor discipline and the smooth conduct of examinations.

The total marks for the Theory and Practical Examinations will be calculated on the basis of 40 for Continuous Internal Assessment and 60 for End Semester Examinations.

The Central Valuation and Examinations will be conducted parallelly.

The Valuation of the written answer scripts will be done by external experts from reputed institutions and also senior faculty members from the Institution.

The Result Passing Board meeting will be held in each semester to approve the results of the candidates appeared for the respective semester examinations. The results will be published in the college website after the approval of the Result Passing Board.

CONTINUOUS INTERNAL ASSESSMENT TESTS AND MODEL EXAMINATIONS

- The Continuous Internal Assessment Test 1 will be conducted after the completion of first 2 Units.
- The Continuous Internal Assessment Test 2 will be conducted after the completion of 3 & 4 Units.
- The Model Examination will be conducted after the completion of all the 5 units.
- For Hall Allotment, Invigilation duty and Squad duty the same procedures may be followed as per the End Semester Examinations
- The valuation of Answer Scripts will be done by the respective Course Faculty.

SPECIAL EXAMINATION

Special Examination : Special examination as per the UGC regulation and Bharathiyar University rules for the students, who suppose to attend notable camps / programmes in connection with co-curricular activities/extension activities that falls on the date of End-of-Semester examinations, will be conducted with the permission of the Principal.

GENERAL REGULATIONS

Admission and Withdrawal

1. All admissions to the college are made as per the Guidelines of University, University Grants Commission and the Government of Tamil Nadu.
2. Application for admission to the college should be submitted only in the prescribed form available in the college office.
3. Admissions are done normally only in the beginning of the academic year.
4. Each student and his / her parent or guardian shall give an undertaking at the time of admission as prescribed by the college from time to time.
5. Any candidate who is found to have obtained admission by false representation will be summarily dismissed with forfeiture of all fees paid.
6. The name of the student will be struck off from the roll, if the student is absent for more than five working days continuously from the date of admission or reopening of the college whichever is later.
7. Students are required to retain the receipts for all the fees paid, duly signed

and issued to them.

8. Student should pay the semester fees on or before the date specified without fail.

9. If a student leaves the college in the middle of any semester he / she cannot claim remission of any portion of the fees.

10. The student has to clear the dues if any Tuition fee, Bus fee etc. to get his Transfer Certificate and other Certificates.

11. If a student leaves the college at the end of an academic year he/she can receive the attendance certificate required by the University if he/she applies for it.

12. The original Transfer and Conduct Certificates submitted to the college at the time of admission will not be returned to the students, and they will be retained by the college.

Attendance and Leave

1. Students should attend all the classes regularly.

2. Attendance is noted for each period at the commencement of the class.

3. University and college rules require REGULAR ATTENDANCE in all the theory and Laboratory classes.

4. Absence of one period in any session is treated as absence of half a day.

5. In case of absence on medical grounds, the student should produce medical Certificate from a registered medical practitioner.

6. The leave application with the counter signature of the parent /guardian / warden and concerned Tutor / Class In-Charge and Head/Dean of the Department should be submitted in advance. In case of emergency, the duly approved leave application should be submitted on the first day of return to the college after the leave.

7. For a student to sit for the End Semester Examinations it is required the he/she has

a. Obtained 75% of attendance for each semester and that attendance

b. Is reckoned in terms of day only and not course wise.

c. Fulfilled his academic obligations to the satisfaction of authorized faculties and other concerned authorities.

d. Performed all the experiments laid down in science Lab manuals and keeping a proper record of each before starting the examination.

8. The Principal is authorized to condone deficiency in attendance up to a maximum of 10% of the number of days for each semester.

9. The Principal may take appropriate disciplinary action in case of continued violation of leave rules.

Conduct, Behavior and Discipline

1. The students shall attend the college wearing clean and suitable clothing according to the approved etiquette.
2. Girl students shall attend the college wearing saree or in traditional salwar kameez with their shawls neatly pinned. Boy students should tuck-in their shirts and should wear shoes.
3. Students should wear their Identity card every day. Identity card should be produced when demanded.
4. Those who have misplaced and lost their Identity Card should get duplicate identity card upon payment of the fine prescribed.
5. Every student shall greet the members of the faculty on his / her first Meeting on the day.
6. When a member of the faculty enters the class room, the students shall rise and remain so till they are asked to sit.
7. No student shall leave the class room or laboratory without the permission of the Class in-charge.
8. No student of one class shall enter any other class under any pretext.
9. Students are not allowed to stand in the verandah of the college during the working hours.
10. Students should not sit on the parapet wall or steps or staircase.
11. Students are forbidden from writing, scribbling and painting on the walls, desks etc.
12. Eve-teasers will be dismissed from the college.
13. Ragging is an offence. Any student found guilty of ragging will be dismissed from the college.
14. Smoking is prohibited inside the college and hostel premises.
15. Students are advised to read notices and circulars put up in the notice boards regularly. Ignorance of any notice or circular thus put up will not be accepted as an excuse for failing to comply with it.
16. Strict silence should be maintained while moving from class room to laboratory and back and also while walking on the verandah and corridor.
17. In case, any criminal case is registered against a student by the law enforcing authorities, he / she should intimate the same within 24 hours to the Principal, failing which he / she is liable for disciplinary action leading to expulsion from the college.
18. The power to take disciplinary action against an erring student is vested with the Head of the Institution.

19. With regard to matters not specified above, students shall aim at conducting themselves in a manner thoroughly suited to the functioning of the college.

20. The students shall bear the cost of the damage to the college property individually/collectively.

21. Students of the college are bound to obey the rules and promote the corporate life in the campus. In the interpretation of the rules and in any academic or disciplinary matter not covered by the rules, they shall accept the decision of the Principal.

22. Usage of mobile phone is prohibited in the college campus during college hours. If any student is found using the mobile phone during college hours, it would be seized.

LIBRARY AND INFORMATION CENTRE

1. All students and faculty members are members of the Central Library of the College.

2. Every student / faculty member should scan the Bar Coded ID Card at the entrance while entering the library.

3. The library is kept open from 9.00 a.m to 6.00 p.m on all days except Sundays and Public Holidays.

4. Each student is entitled to keep a book for two weeks from the date of issue. It should be returned on or before the due date specified on the due date slip. But, it may be reissued to the same person if it is not wanted by someone else.

5. A student failing to return a book on the due date will be fined Re. 1/- per day from the due date (14 days after the issue). Sundays and other holidays are excluded for this purpose.

6. Students are prohibited from underlining or writing anywhere in the Library books.

7. While borrowing books from the Library, students are requested to verify that the books are in proper shape without any mutilation of pages or missing of pages. If any damage or scribbling is found, it should immediately be reported to the Librarian.

8. A student will lose the privilege of borrowing books if he / she repeatedly returns the book late or damages the books in any form.

9. For any mutilation of book(s) found at a later date, the last borrower of the book will be held responsible.

10. The librarian reserves the right to recall any book at any time.

11. Periodicals lying on the tables in the Library should not be removed

from the reading room.

12. Students are requested to use all the magazines and journals in the library with care.

13. Students who have been issued with identification card should produce the same to the Librarian or Library staff on demand.

14. All complaints and suggestions should in the first instance be made to the Librarian, who will, wherever necessary, refer them to the Principal.

15. Students must return all the library books at the end of their programme or at the time of their leaving the college whichever is earlier. All dues should be paid.

16. Transfer certificate and conduct certificate will not be issued to the students unless all the books due from them are returned.

17. Students are expected to use the books with care. If a book is lost/damaged, the borrower should replace the book or pay penalty to the tune of TWO to FIVE times the cost of the book.

18. Internet facility is available for the students and faculty members in the Library. CD ROM"s are available on a variety of subjects in the Digital Library.

HOSTEL

ADMISSION

1. Application for admission to the student's hostel can be made in the prescribed form only.
2. Student admitted to the college is not automatically eligible to become a member of the hostel.
3. Every student, before getting admission to students hostel shall give an undertaking in writing that he will abide by the Rules and Regulations.
4. Before admission, each student has to pay Admission Fees, Caution Deposit, Room Rent and other charges, which may be revised from time to time.

DISCIPLINE

1. The inmates of the hostel are expected to maintain strict discipline inside and outside the premises and uphold the good name of the student's hostel and the institution.
2. Shouting, whistling or causing disturbance will be treated as breach of discipline.
3. Smoking is strictly prohibited. Any student found to have consumed intoxicating drinks/drugs will be dismissed from the hostel immediately

without any enquiry.

4. The inmates should refrain from taking part in anti-social activities.
5. The inmates should neither involve themselves in any political activity nor be members of any political party.
6. The inmates should not convene any meeting within the hostel premises or outside the hostel without the written permission of the Chief Warden.
7. The inmates are not allowed to put up or circulate any notice without permission from the Chief Warden.
8. Abnormal activities of any nature causing disturbance to neighbors should not be carried out in rooms.
9. The inmates should not nail on the walls for hanging their clothes or posters. Posters of any kind are prohibited within the hostel premises.
10. The inmates should not remain in the hostel during the college working hours and at other times when their presence is expected in the institution, except with the permission of the Chief Warden/Deputy Warden.
11. No student should stay away from hostel any day without the permission of the Chief Warden/Deputy Warden.
12. Day scholars are not permitted to enter the hostel.
13. Inmates shall be permitted to go out for outing only with the permission of the Chief Warden/Deputy Warden.
14. No person other than inmate should enter inside the hostel. If such contingency arises, permission may be obtained from the Deputy Warden. If anyone is present without permission, action will be taken against the inmate in whose room the person is found.
15. Audio and Video systems, computer and other electrical appliances shall be used only with the prior permission of the Deputy Warden. Terms and conditions for the use of such appliances will be stipulated from time to time. Audio and Video systems including walkman should not be played after 9.00 p.m.
16. The inmates should treat others as their fellow brothers/sisters irrespective of their caste, creed and religion.
17. Ragging in any form is strictly prohibited. It is to be noted that ragging is a criminal offence under the law. Any student found ragging/hurting junior students by word or deed will be expelled from the hostel and college.
18. Any student who is removed from the college will automatically cease to be inmate of the hostel.
19. During Silent Study Hours (9.00 p.m to 10.00 p.m) the inmates should be present in their respective rooms, study the course materials and not to use any electronic gadgets. The room door should be kept opened during

the study hour.

DINING:

20. Vegetarian food will be served in the hostel according to the menu and rates prescribed by the management. Non-Vegetarian food may be served on requisition at an extra cost.

22. Mess charges will be based on dividing system.
23. Hostellers should not demand any special service from the cook or other servants.
- 24.No mess reduction will be given for the absence of less than 5 days. For an absence of 5 or more (n) days, reduction for (n) days will be given only with prior permission.
- 25.The hostel mess bill for the previous month will be displayed on the notice board by the first week of every month.
- 26.If the inmate fails to pay the bill before the end of every month, he/she will have to vacate the hostel immediately.
- 27.Mode of payment: By Cash or DD in favor of "The Principal, Dr. SNS Rajalakshmi College of Arts & Science" payable at Coimbatore.
- 28.Visitors are permitted to see their wards only during visitor's time.
- 29.Hostel students are permitted to use **Mobile Phones** in all places of the hostel premises except **Dining Hall & Study Room**.
- 30.Hostel students are instructed to make an entry in the hostel movement register and submit their hostel identity card in the main gate, when they go for outing and the same may be collected while returning
- 31.Hostel students are permitted to wear **Half-Trousers & Dhotis** only in

the hostel premises (except dining hall) and not permitted to wander in the college premises.

32. Hostel students are advised to stay in their respective allotted rooms and should not go into the neighbors room.

33. Senior students of the hostel are cautioned to stay in their rooms and wing and not allowed to go to the first year student's rooms and wing.

34. Hostel Main gate will remain closed from 9.30 a.m. to 4.10 p.m. during the college working days.

TRAINING AND PLACEMENT

- The College has a Training and Placement Cell with full time Placement Officer who is assisted by a coordinator from each department.
- The Placement Cell offers weekly two to three hours placement training for all UG and PG students, paying special attention to personality, leadership and skill development.
- The College has entered into MoU with three different external expert training institutions namely Six Phase Finishing School, Talent Sprint and ATIC Academy to enhance the soft skills of students through group discussion, aptitude, communication skills, etc.
- The Placement Cell arranges mock interviews by inviting experts from reputed companies. It also arranges on campus and off campus placement opportunities with the cooperation of multinational companies.

INSTRUCTIONS TO STUDENTS REGARDING RAGGING

- It is brought to the notice of the students that the Supreme Court of India in SLP (C) No. 24295/2004 has suggested punishment of students with expulsion etc., if found guilty of ragging in educational institutions. Tamil Nadu Prohibition of Ragging Act 1997 has also prohibited ragging inside and outside the College Campus.
- The said Act of the Tamil Nadu Government says that "Ragging" means "display of noisy, disorderly conduct, doing any act which causes or is likely to cause physical or psychological harm or raise apprehension or fear or shame or embarrassment to a student in any educational institution and includes,
 - a. teasing, abusing of, playing practical jokes on, or causing hurt to such student (or)
 - b. asking the student to do any act or perform something which such student will not in the ordinary case be willingly do"

If a student is found guilty of ragging, the punishment shall be

- (i) imprisonment for a term which may extend up to two years and a fine which may extend up to ten thousand rupees (or)
- (ii) dismissal from the college and such student shall not be admitted in any other educational institution (or)
- (iii) Suspension from the institution by the Head of the educational institution.

- The students are therefore directed to conduct themselves properly inside and outside the college campus in their own interest.

BEST OUTGOING STUDENT AWARD

An award called “Best Outgoing Student Award” is instituted confining to students of UG programmes. The student for this award is selected based on the overall performance in Academic, Co-curricular, Extra-Curricular Activities, Conduct and Behavior. The award will be Conferred on College Day , Consisting of a cash prize and a Certificate.

National Cadet Corps (NCC):

2 (TN) Artillery battery Army Wing was raised in the year 2021-2022 the strength of 50 Cadets vide their NCC Dte (TN,P&AN) Chennai letter No 325/CBE/P&C(i) dated 10 Dec 2021

A total number of 40 parades for duration of 80 hours in a year to be completed by the Institution in each training year. The cadets attending the parades should be provided with refreshment of minimum Rs. 10/- per hour of parade regularly. The parade statement is to be sent to this unit on the same day through the PI staff attending the same of by post next day.

Cadets will be allowed will be appeared for B & C Certificate Examinations as per the norms prescribed by the NCC Unit.

Social Service (NSS):

The following activities are regularly and successfully conducted. The NSS unit organizes

1. Special camp for 7 days.
2. Dental, Eye Checkup and Blood Donation Camp for the students and nearby village people.
3. Planting saplings in college premises and in villages.
4. Fuel and electricity saving and other awareness rallies.

Bharathiar University has sanctioned three NSS units for the college and the college is awaiting the 4th Unit. Each NSS unit has a strength of 100 volunteers. Regular activities of NSS and special camps are conducted every year in the adopted villages towards social service.

Service to Humankind (YRC)

Youth Red Cross is an association which was started to serve the needy people with a number of student volunteers. In the college, this unit is functioning with 100 volunteers who are really interested, enthusiastic and service minded. Several programmes are organized regularly.

Promotion of Health Seeking Behavior (RRC)

Red Ribbon Club focuses to create awareness among students about HIV, AIDS and Blood Donation. There are about 100 student volunteers in this club who are trained to create awareness among the people in the society about these diseases. The club organizes voluntary camps with the help of the student volunteers under the guidance of the RRC Officer. Voluntary camps are conducted for the students in various disciplines and for the common people in the society by visiting to a particular village or area and creating awareness among the people about deadly disease.

Environmental Management (Eco-Club)

The main objectives of the Eco-Club are

1. To motivate the students to keep their surroundings green and clean by undertaking plantation of trees.
2. To promote ethos of conservation of water by minimizing the use of water.
3. To motivate the students to imbibe habits and life style for minimum waste generation, source separation of waste and disposing the waste to the nearest storage point.
4. To educate students to create awareness among public and sanitary workers, so as to stop the indiscriminate burning of waste this causes respiratory diseases.
5. To sensitize the students to minimize the use of plastic bags, not to throw them in public places as they choke drains and sewers, cause water logging and provide breeding ground for mosquitoes.
6. To organize tree plantation programmes, awareness programmes and several other programmes such as quiz, essay writing, painting competition, rallies etc. regarding various environmental issues and educate society about re-use of waste material and preparation of products out of waste.
7. To organize Nature Trail in Wild Life Sanctuaries/Parks/Forest areas to

know about the Bio-diversity.

Health and Hygiene

The main objective of the Health and Hygiene Club is to motivate the students to pay attention to health and to keep hygienic practices. Also, the members will educate fellow students about Health and Hygiene and will create awareness in the society.

Sports: Theory and Practical

Sports and games play a significant role in the life of students. The physical education department is headed by a Physical Director and an Assistant Physical Director. The college has infrastructure for a number of indoor and outdoor games as well as for field events. These facilities are sufficient to practice and to conduct the Inter-Collegiate tournaments and Intramural Sports. The college is equipped with Football field, Basket ball court, Handball court, Shuttle court, Volleyball court, Ball Badminton court, Tennikoit court, Cricket pitch for net practice and one well-maintained pitch for matches. Independent training facilities are available for both the boys and girls. A Gym is attached to the physical education department in which a number of single and multi-stationed machines and other weight training accessories are available to provide opportunity for the students to train themselves to keep their body fit and athletic. Students are also educated in theory of sports.

Yoga: Theory and Practice

The Theory & Practice of Yoga aims at mental fitness through learning and performing yoga. It provides the mental strength and balanced life. Different types of yoga will be helping to project the life with great mental power.

Disaster Management

Disaster is a serious disruption of the functioning of a community or a society. It involves widespread human, material, economic or environmental impacts. Floods, hurricanes, earthquakes and volcano eruptions are natural disaster. Our students can involve in risk mitigation and management of the disasters joining hands with the Collectorate of Coimbatore through Disaster Management programmes.

Craft and Fine Arts

Craft and Fine Arts will give the students an opportunity to show their talents in Craft and Fine arts.

4. To offer Professional Training for competitive examinations.
5. To infuse among the students confidence and faith in themselves.
6. To encourage them to be self-reliant, positive and tolerant.
7. To boost their morale in case of poor performance in their academic

activities.

8. To maintain students' regularity and performance in studies.
9. To encourage advanced and gifted learners as well as best performers to excel in their studies.
10. To interact with parents regarding their wards' performance in the college.
